INSPECTOR COMMENTS:

- 1. The lockup is comprised of a booking area and four cells located in three separate blocks. Cells 1 and 2 are in one block which also has a shower and is designated as a male detainee area. Cell 3 and Cell 4 are in two separate blocks with Cell 4 also having a shower. Cell 4 is designated as a female detainee area and Cell 3 as male/female depending on population. Not counted in the facility's capacity are three secure interview rooms located in a hallway adjacent to the lockup.
- 2. All cells are equipped with steel beds, combination steel washbasin/toilets and secure light fixtures.
- 3. The booking area is video monitored and equipped with a LiveScan, breathalyzer, first aid kit, a metal table secured to the floor which has four cuffing rings and a secure metal bench with three cuffing rings.
- 4. The facility is CALEA accredited and was last accredited in 2014.
- 5. If meals are required, they are purchased from a local restaurant.
- 6. Cell checks are conducted in person every 15 minutes, exceeding the requirements of the Illinois Municipal Jail and Lockup Standards.
- 7. Arresting officers perform jail duties and receive refresher training during in-service roll call periods.
- 8. The facility receives fire safety inspections every August and February by the Oswego Fire Protection District.
- 9. The lockup is inspected daily by the third shift supervisor who completes a checklist.
