INVESTIGATIONS

Investigation Spotlight

In March detectives concluded a lengthy burglary investigation at two local retail establishments from 2017. The four offenders were identified and found to be part of a larger burglary ring that hit multiple jurisdictions in multiple states. The FBI is charging the ring with over 200 crimes, including ours. Detectives also concluded an Unlawful Use of Credit Card investigation at a local retail establishment. The offender obtained the card from a theft in Aurora and used the card in Oswego. The offender was identified through surveillance video and found to have multiple warrants for similar offenses. Detectives reconciled more than 50 revoked FOID/CCL cases from ISP.
