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## INVESTIGATIONS

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This month detectives continued their ongoing investigation into a sexual assault that occurred 12 years ago. A warrant was obtained and served for the suspect's DNA, and the suspect was interviewed, we are awaiting DNA results. A local bank reported an attempted forgery, in which a male falsified information for a loan. Detectives obtained a confession, but the banking establishment only wanted the situation documented and did not want the male charged with a crime. Detectives worked with patrol and TFO's to investigate a shooting that occurred in Ogden Falls. The shell casings that were collected were analyzed and we learned that one of the

guns used in our shooting has already been recovered by another jurisdiction. Investigations wrapped up a month’s long stalking investigation. After many false leads, interviews, and sting operations, detectives surmised the female was receiving “stalking” items from her husband. A lengthy interview and interrogation was conducted that led to a confession.
