### **INVESTIGATIONS**

#### **Investigation Highlight**

The offender in an arson who fled to Texas was extradited back to Oswego to face charges. Investigations recovered a Bobcat mower stolen from First Place Rental, and valued at \$6,000. Investigations learned the identity of a suspect that passed two counterfeit \$100 bills at three separate businesses in town. Investigations learned the identity of a female who damaged a vehicle by scratching it and pouring a sugary liquid into the gas tank. Charges are being sought. The offender, who sexually abused a child and then attempted to flee to Australia, was sentenced to 13 years in prison for Predatory Criminal Sexual Abuse of a Child. Upon his release from prison he will be required to register as a sex offender for the remainder of his life.
