### **INVESTIGATIONS**

### **Investigation Highlight**

In October, Detectives effectively stopped a string of thefts that were occurring in the downtown area when an offender was taken into custody. Detectives had obtained a warrant against the offender, who was using "movie money" to steal from cab drivers and fast food delivery drivers. The offender was interviewed by detectives while he was in custody at Kendall County Jail and received a confession for

one of the offenses in Oswego as well as one that occurred in Aurora. Detectives are still working on the other offenses he is believed to have committed.

Detectives also concluded a long term investigation into a massage parlor. Detectives worked with state and federal agencies to investigate allegations of prostitution and licensing violations. The investigation culminated in an arrest of two females on charges of prostitution and performing massages without a license.

Detective Guisti, who recently was certified as an Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) investigator, received a cybertip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) about a potential image of child pornography that was posted to Snapchat. Detective Guisti learned a school resource officer had already started an investigation into the incident. NCMEC had received the notification from Snapchat, and Detective Guisti used his ICAC training to continue the investigation.

Detectives attended the Illinois Homicide Investigators Association conference in Itasca. This is a two day educational conference in which detectives attend educational sessions lead by industry experts. The conference also counts toward the statutory continuing education requirements to investigate homicides.
