Investigation Spotlight

The investigation into a bank robbery at the TCF Bank at 2540 Route 30, Oswego, on 12/20/10 has resulted in two subjects being charged. Federal Indictments for Bank Robbery were issued on 2/15/12 for two subjects who are currently in Federal custody.

Oswego Police assisted the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) with their investigation since they have primary investigative authority in these cases. Evidence recovered at the scene by Oswego Police, which was later analyzed at the Illinois State Police Crime Lab, was instrumental in the investigation.
