CITIZEN ASSISTED RADAR MONITORING

The C.P.A.A.A. had an active month of August. They focused again on speeding vehicles on Pearces Ford near Waubensee Circle and stop sign violations on Grapevine Trail at Concord. The results are listed below:

All registered owners will be sent letters advising of the violations. The letters also indicate our request for compliance or future violations may result in a citation being issued.

MISCELLANEOUS ENFORCEMENT & EDUCATIONAL EFFORTS

We continued to partner with Oswego East High School, Oswego Community Bank and Oswego Ace Hardware to provide driver safety messages on their respective marquees. The messages include, “You Drink & Drive, You Lose”, “No Seatbelt, No Excuse”, “Drive Now Text Later”, “Look Twice, Save a Life”, “Over the Limit, Under Arrest.” This educational campaign helps support our enforcement efforts generated through the Sustained Traffic Enforcement Program (S.T.E.P.) Grant.

On Sunday August 5th, 2012 the Oswego Police Department assisted in traffic control for Allied First Bank’s Annual Triathlon. The race called for the closure of Route 71 from 7:00 A.M. till about 11:20 A.M. A team effort provide for a safe race for the participants while creating an alternate detour route for motorists affected by the closure. Over 300 participants registered for the event this year. The triathlon will be moved to mid-July for 2013.



The Oswego Police Department proposed a change in ordinance 9-3-16 U-Turns Prohibited. Since the installation of the raised barrier median on Douglas Road south of U.S. Route 34, motorists are making u-turns at the end of the median. This situation creates a potential crash risk to unexpected motorists in the area. The ordinance was updated that now prohibits such u-turns.
