### COMMUNITY CONCERNS

#### SATURATION & SPECIAL ENFORCMENT DETAILS

In December three saturation patrols were completed by members of the Traffic Enforcement Unit.

In addition to saturation patrols, Traffic Officers completed 12 directed patrols. As part of their monthly directed patrol assignments, Traffic Officers continue to monitor two subdivisions. The home owner association (HOA) liaison officers assigned to the subdivisions selected by Traffic Officers are informed of the additional enforcement efforts planned and/or completed for their subdivision. This enforcement approach is intended to supplement liaison officer’s traffic efforts within their assigned subdivision.

Traffic Officers completed directed patrols in the following subdivisions; Ashcroft, Blackberry Knolls, Churchill Club, and Heritage. Below are the results of their efforts:

## CITIZEN ASSISTED RADAR MONITORING

Alumni from our Citizen Police Academy Association (CPAA) completed three radar monitoring details. During each two hour detail, CPAA members monitored the areas of Bluegrass Parkway, Heritage Drive, Prairieview Drive, and Treasure Drive. These locations were selected as means to determine whether additional speed enforcement is necessary and to support ongoing efforts on these roadways subdivision.

As a result of these details, nine courtesy letters (5 Bluegrass Parkway and 4 Treasure Drive) were mailed to motorists exceeding the posted speed limit by 8 or more mph. The radar monitoring program continues to be a useful tool in supporting our enforcement efforts.

## COMMUNITY TRAFFIC CONCERNS

Our department continued to address areas that were identified as traffic concerns during prior months. In December, one of the previous extra patrol locations was removed from the list. This location, N. Adams Street, had been on our extra patrol list for 2 ½ years. The original complainant was mailed correspondence informing them the roadway was being removed from our extra patrol list. The Homeowners (HOA) liaison officer assigned to the subdivision will be responsible for managing future enforcement efforts at that location. Decembers' Extra Patrol results are listed below:

## MISCELLANEOUS ENFORCEMENT & EDUCATIONAL EFFORTS

In preparation for the Christmas and New Year Holiday Weekends, we partnered with the Oswego East High School, Oswego Community Bank, Oswego Ace Hardware, and Marcleys Mini Mart to provide driver safety messages on their respective marquees. The messages included, "You Drink & Drive, You Lose", "No Seatbelt, No Excuse", "Over the Limit, Under Arrest." This educational campaign helps support our enforcement efforts generated through the Sustained Traffic Enforcement Program (S.T.E.P.) Grant. This two pronged approach is intended to improve motorist's driving behaviors and increase safety on our roadways.

Members from the Traffic Unit acted as instructors for the teen driver safety program, Operation Impact, which is provided to all Oswego District 308 Drivers Education students. During the presentation, officers discuss crash statistics as it relates to young drivers, the main contributing causes of crashes, the top five contributing factors for fatal crashes, several guidelines regarding the Illinois Graduated Drivers Licensing Program, the dynamics of a traffic stop and what drivers should do if they stopped by the police.

## **S.M.A.R.T. TRAILERS**

During the month of December, the message board was utilized during the Village’s Christmas Walk event. The message board was programmed to advise motorists to be aware of increased pedestrian traffic in the downtown area. Public Works provided an additional message board for the event and it was placed on Washington Street at Harrison Street.

The message board was used at the entrance to the Wal-Mart and Meijer’s Stores and acted as a deterrent for retail theft during Christmas Holiday Shopping Season. The trailer was programmed to display a message that reminded patrons of the consequences for committing the offense of retail theft.

The S.M.A.R.T. Trailer was deployed to two different locations throughout the Village. These locations were selected in an effort to educate the motoring public of the posted speed limit for each roadway. No speed studies were conducted at these locations.

During the last week of December, the message board was placed on westbound Route 34 & 5<sup>th</sup> Street and programmed with the safety reminder “You Drink & Drive, You Lose!” The message acted as an educational tool and a reminder to motorists that officers would be out enforcing alcohol related offenses.

There were no traffic studies completed during the month of December.

The Investigations Division conducted alcohol compliance checks at restaurants and bars within the Village that sell alcoholic beverages. These checks are done to ensure that underage subjects are not able to purchase alcoholic beverages. Twenty-five locations were checked which resulted in four violations. Ordinance tickets were issued to the offenders.
