During the month of June, the S.M.A.R.T. Trailers were utilized during the annual PrairieFest Event. The trailers were both placed on southbound Route 71. The older trailer was used as a tool to notify motorists of their speed of travel. The trailer equipped with the message board was programmed with a message which informed motorists of the main parking locations for the event. The message board was also used to inform motorists of the delays they might experience in the downtown business district during Sunday's PrairieFest Parade.

As a result of the continuous call for enforcement at the intersection of Route 71 and Forest Avenue, the S.M.A.R.T. Trailer was programmed with the message, "No Passing on the Shoulder". Although there is a regulatory sign already in place at this location, it is at times disregarded by motorists. The message board acted as a supplement to the existing regulatory sign.

The trailers were also deployed to two different locations. These locations were selected in an effort to educate the motoring public of the posted speed limit for each roadway. No speed studies were conducted at these locations.

Pedestrian Crosswalk Details

In an effort to bring awareness to pedestrian safety, Officers posed as pedestrians in the downtown business district. The first detail was completed on June 1st. It was the first of several pedestrian details which will take place during the summer and fall of this year. The details are part of a campaign to educate motorists about the law requiring vehicles to stop for pedestrians in marked crosswalks.

The details will be completed at the intersections of Washington and Main Street, Washington and Harrison Street and Madison and Jackson Street. Each intersection is posted with portable 'yield to pedestrian within crosswalk' signs. During the detail,

motorists who did not yield the right of way to the officers posing as pedestrians were issued a warning or citation/ticket.

During the three pedestrian crossing details during the month of June, many motorists obeyed the law and yielded the right of way to officers walking within the crosswalk; however, several cars did not stop. As a result, five warnings and one ticket was issued for failure to yield to a pedestrian in a crosswalk.

Citizen Assisted Radar Monitoring Program

In June, alumni from our Citizen Police Academy completed six radar monitoring details. During each of the 2 hour details, they monitored the areas of W. Washington @ Millstream, Main Street @ Fuller Street, N. Adams and Forest Avenue. All of these locations were selected as a means to determine whether additional enforcement efforts are needed. A total of four courtesy letters were mailed to motorists who were recorded exceeding the posted speed limit by more than 8 mph. Most details continue to be completed on weekends, typically on Saturday morning.

After receiving a complaint of motorists disobeying the stop sign on Prairieview Drive at Morgan Valley Drive, CPAA members were used as a means to document the severity of the concern. On two occasions, CPAA members recorded the number of motorists who failed to stop at the above-mentioned stop sign. Based on their observations, it was found only five of the 31 motorists actually stopped at the stop sign during a two hour period of time. As a result, this location was placed in the Extra Patrol Log. Additionally, Traffic Officers have completed directed patrols at this intersection. Our department will continue to use CPAA members to monitor problematic intersections.

June 2009 Seatbelt Survey Results

In June, a Village-wide seatbelt survey was conducted. A total of 27 intersections/locations were surveyed. The survey was used as a means to determine if seatbelt usage has increased throughout the calendar year as a result of our enforcement efforts.

Our community service and cadet officers were used to complete the survey. Most of the surveys were completed between 1200 – 1400 hours. The CSO or cadet officers checked 100 vehicles at each location. The survey applied only to passenger vehicles. During the surveys, if an officer was not sure whether the driver was seat belted, the vehicle was not included in the survey. Based on the survey, the Village's current seatbelt compliance average is 94.4%. The average seatbelt compliance within the State of Illinois is currently 91.7%. The results of the June survey reflect a slight increase as compared to the seatbelt survey completed in December 2008, which reflected an average compliance of 94%. The June seatbelt survey followed our May seatbelt enforcement efforts through the IMAGE Grant. During the May grant, our department issued 185 seatbelt tickets and 18 seatbelt warnings. It appears our enforcement efforts had a positive impact on seatbelt usage within the Village of Oswego. Overall, recent seatbelt compliance figures remain significantly higher as compared to the department's first seatbelt survey, which was completed in January 2005. During that survey, the average compliance was 79%.
