EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT OF OSWEGO IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19

(Parking and Real Estate Orders)

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic continues to spread across Illinois and the United States; and,

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, I, Troy Parlier, Village President of Oswego, declared a Local State of Emergency to assist residents and ease certain Village regulations during the COVID-19 outbreak; and,

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, Governor J.B. Pritzker issued Executive Order No. 8 ("Stay at Home Order"), in which he required all non-essential business and operations to cease, and ordered individuals to stay in their homes except in limited situations; and,

WHEREAS, the Stay at Home Order includes several exceptions for Essential Businesses and Operations, including real estate services; and,

WHEREAS, the Illinois Department of Financial & Professional Regulation has informed the Village of Oswego that real estate showings are included in the Stay at Home Order's exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, I previously issued Executive Orders 2020-01 and 2020-02 to provide assistance and directives for residents and businesses during this emergency; and,

WHEREAS, I have determined that additional actions are necessary to further assist and protect residents as they operate under the Stay at Home Order;

NOW, THEREFORE, by the powers vested in me as the Village President of the Village of Oswego, and pursuant to Section 1-6-8 of the Oswego Village Code, Section 11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-1-6), and Section 11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act (20 ILCS 3305/11). **I HEREBY ORDER THE FOLLOWING:**

Section 1: Overnight parking restrictions in the Village of Oswego, as detailed in Section 9-4-16 of the Village Code of Ordinances, are suspended through April 15, 2020 and shall not be enforced.

Section 2: Through April 15, 2020, individuals are not permitted to attend real estate showings within the Village of Oswego while they are sick or exhibiting any symptoms of illness, including, but not limited to, fever, coughing, or shortness of breath. Healthy individuals attending real estate showings should still take all recommended precautions regarding social distancing and sanitary measures.
