

About the venue

Musicians, actors, and performers of all kinds have an outdoor stage to call home in Oswego at Venue 1012, at 1012 Station Drive, in Oswego's growing Orchard Road corridor.

The 3-acre park and venue will be constructed in multiple phases. Phase I, officially opened on Aug. 19, 2021, includes a 40'x60' bandshell, associated power, basic lighting, a service driveway, trash cans, and site grading and seeding for blanket and lawn chair seating. Future phases will include additional landscaping, semi-permanent seating, entraceway paver bricks, art installations, restrooms, concession stand, playground, walking paths, and functional and aesthetic improvements to the bandshell.
