# **Everbridge Mass Notification System**

Help us keep you informed when situations warrant notification!

The Kencom Public Safety Center has an Emergency Notification system designed to provide emergency notification to residents and businesses in Kendall County. This system gives us the ability to deliver pre-recorded emergency notifications and informational messages to either targeted areas or the entire County via telephone calls, text messages, or email.

To learn more about how to stay informed during emergency situations, please read all the details <u>here</u>.

The system is only as effective as the telephone database supporting it. If your phone number is not in the database, you will not be notified. Please don't assume your information is included.

When you register you will be able to select the types of notifications you want to receive. You can also sign up to receive notifications for another location that you may be concerned about within Kendall County (such as your employer location, child's school, parent's house, etc.).

This information will only be used for emergency and community notification purposes and will not be sold or given to any outside entity.
