Kendall County Special Response Team

The Oswego Police Department is a member agency of the Kendall County Special Response Team (SRT). The team consists of 18 police officers from seven police departments and 5 paramedics from the Oswego Fire Protection District. The Oswego Police Department currently has 4 patrol officers and 2 sergeants assigned to the team. SRT's mission is to provide a highly trained, highly skilled police tactical unit to substantially reduce the risk of injury or loss of life to citizens, police officers and suspects. Recognizing that a well-trained team response to critical incidents usually results in a successful resolution, it is the intent of the SRT to provide such a team as a resource for Kendall County law enforcement agencies and their citizens.
