Crime Notification

Oswego Police have many reports over the past month related to catalytic converter thefts. Please be aware and take the following precautions to limit the possibility of becoming a victim:

- ${\sim}{\rm Keep}$ your vehicle parked in your garage whenever possible ${\sim}{\rm Park}$ in a well-lit area
- ~Park in areas with video surveillance
