# SPRING STRIDES

WE JUST WRAPPED UP OUR ANNUAL STATE OF THE VILLAGE ADDRESS, and we have excellent news to report. The 2023 fiscal year that started in May 2022 has been strong with only three more reporting months left. Our general fund revenue is up 11 percent over budget year-to-date, while expenses are running 2 percent lower than budget. This gives us a current budget surplus over \$4 million year-to-date. Our sales tax receipts continue to exceed estimates indicating a robust local economy.

Spring signals the start of the construction season and we have a lot of improvements moving ahead in Oswego!

The first leg of the Wolfs Crossing reconstruction has been designed, engineered, approved and sent out for bid. We will break ground at the Harvey Road intersection as early as April and look for a completion date by Thanksgiving this year.

You may have noticed the construction going on at Collins Road as well. We are working with the County to connect Collins Road all the way to Minkler Road. Downtown, we look forward to traffic lights being installed on Main and Harrison streets. They should be completed and operational by July. Our road program will take a giant leap forward this year as we look to repave 16 lane miles of road!

Spring also means our entertainment season is about to begin. We kick it off on May 6 and 7 with Wine on the Fox. Over at Venue 1012, we launch the season on May 27 with Country Bash and a Memorial Day tribute from the Oswego Pops Orchestra on May 28

We hope to see you out and about enjoying the change of the season! Enjoy the Spring.

# CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS TO EASE CONGESTION WILL START SOON

# WOI FS CROSSING

THE FIRST MAJOR PROJECT on Wolfs Crossing will start this spring to help ease traffic congestion along the corridor.

The Village will replace the four-way stop-controlled intersection of Wolfs Crossing and Harvey Road with a modern roundabout. Wolfs Crossing will also be widened to four lanes from east of the entrance to Oswego East High School to east of Devoe Drive. The project will also include

construction of a new water main from Fifth Street to Devoe Drive, which will improve water pressure on the east side of the Village.

The Village will release additional information regarding road closures required as part of the project once the timelines have been established with the project team. The Village is requiring road closures to work around the school calendar due to the project's proximity to Oswego East High School. The project is scheduled to be completed by the end of November 2023.

Nearly half of the \$10.2 million project cost comes from federal

and state grant funds. This project is the first of several phases planned to improve Wolfs Crossing between Route 34 and Route 30. The Village is currently developing plans for improvements at Douglas Road and Wolfs Crossing.

The Village has been planning for the widening of Wolfs Crossing since 2016. The Wolf Corridor Advisory Team studied current and projected traffic demands, evaluated road improvement scenarios and sought public input. The advisory team recommended the roundabout design as the most effective and safest way to manage traffic through the corridor. The project also includes bike and pedestrian improvements.


Due to the projected cost of the project, the Village is improving the project in phases to maximize federal and state infrastructure funds, reducing the cost to local tax payers. Developer impact fees will also fund a portion of the project.

# **DOWNTOWN TRAFFIC SIGNALS**

Two new traffic signals will be installed in downtown Oswego this spring to help improve pedestrian safety and traffic flow.

The signals will be constructed on US 34/Washington Street at the intersections of Main Street and Harrison Street. The new traffic signals will feature ADA-compliant pedestrian signals, lighted street signs and decorative finishes. Pedestrian ramps at the intersections will also be reconstructed.

All signals on US Route 34 from Illinois Route 31, near Village Hall, to Illinois Route 25, at the intersection of Madison and Chicago, will be electronically interconnected to provide better traffic flow. In addition, the railroad warning signals on US Route 34 will communicate with the traffic signals to ensure that vehicles can clear the tracks prior to a train approaching.

On occasion, temporary lane closures will be necessary to accomplish the work, and several sidewalks will be impacted in the area. Please use caution when walking or driving through the work zone.

The project is expected to be completed by the end of July.

# BRUSH AND YARD WASTE COLLECTION

# YARD WASTE PICK-UP STARTS APRIL 3

Groot's yard waste program will begin the week of April 3 and continue weekly through December 4.

Yard waste is defined as grass or shrubbery cuttings, leaves, small tree limbs and other materials accumulated from the care of lawns, shrubbery, vines and trees. Yard waste material will be collected only if it is placed in a 30-gallon Kraft paper bag with one Groot yard waste sticker affixed to the bag's front.

Yard waste stickers costs \$2.50 each, the same price as 2022, and are available at Oswego Jewel locations, Ace Hardware, Liane's Family Pantry, Meijer and Village Hall.

Yard waste will be collected on the same day as your regularly scheduled garbage day. Yard waste, trash and recycling must be placed at the curb by 6 a.m. on your collection day.

A cost effective and environmentally friendly composting option is also offered by Groot. The subscription program for yard waste and fruit and vegetable scraps is \$141 per season and includes a 95-gallon cart for weekly collection. For information, call Groot at 630-892-9294.

# **BRUSH PICKUP STARTS IN MAY**

THE VILLAGE offers free brush collection throughout the growing season by zone. See below for brush collection zones.

### **RESTRICTIONS**

Brush is defined as tree and bush branches less than 5 inches in diameter. Crews will not pick up logs, wood, root balls, cuttings or grass clippings as these will clog and possibly damage the machines.

If you place materials out too early, or include unacceptable items, an orange tag will be placed on your door indicating the reason.

# **COLLECTION GUIDELINES**

Place all brush at the curb by 7 a.m. on Monday morning of the designated week, but no earlier than noon the Friday before. Public Works trucks will pass through an area once and will not return for brush placed after the deadline. Place unbundled brush parallel or perpendicular to the street in neat bundles with all cut ends facing the same direction.

Do not put brush in the street, in a container, or pile brush higher than four feet.

# **BRUSH COLLECTION ZONES**

**Zone A** includes all properties east of the Fox River and north of Route 34, as well as those properties west of the Fox River and north of Mill Road.

**Zone B** includes all properties east of the Fox River and south of Route 34, as well as those properties west of the Fox River and south of Mill Road.

The Village does not accept landscaping waste, tree branches, or tree removals as a result of contracted work or large-scale tree-trimming or removal. Crews will not remove brush from commercial, industrial or other non-residential properties. For more information visit www.oswegoil.org/brush.

# **SPRING CLEANUP**

Groot will provide a free spring cleanup collection for additional household waste, yard waste and bulk items on your regularly scheduled garbage day the week of April 10.

Place yard waste without stickers in 30-gallon Kraft bags; plastic bags are unacceptable. Items such as old couches, rugs and mattresses will be collected. Note: Groot will not pick up appliances, televisions, electronics or plastic bags containing yard waste. Place all items, along with your routine garbage and recycling, at the curb by 6 a.m. on your regular collection day.

# WATER MAIN FLUSHING

Public Works crews will flush water mains from May 1 to June 2. Signs will be posted to alert residents. Work begins at 7:30 a.m. To avoid rust discoloration of clothes, finish your laundry before 7 a.m. or begin after 6 p.m. on days that crews are in your neighborhood.

This task is performed in spring and fall per Illinois EPA recommendation. Flushing cleans water mains by running high flows of water through fire hydrants to get rid of iron deposits that could produce colored water and possibly damage water meters. Flushing also helps deliver fresh water to dead end water mains.
